Nearby lived his daughter by his unknown 1st wife: MARTHA L. (Luiza), wife of W. C. (William Coleman) HARRIS (p.331, Dwelling 674, Family 705) with their nine children, including ELLEN HARRIS (Marguerite Ellen Harris, born 21 Feb 1855, grandmother of Mrs. Cora McKenzie Peeples).

2. US Census 1850 Hardin Co., Tenn. (Copy submitted with DAR Application) taken 9 Oct 1850, 6th Civil Dist., p.209-B, Dwelling 120, Family No.124, Coleman appears with wife (2nd or 3rd?) Jane Harris, known to be a sister of WILLIAM COLEMAN HARRIS, husband of Coleman Milam's daughter, Martha Luiza Milam, p. 297-B, House No.88, Family No.92. Next door in House No. 89, Family No. 93 are John and Sarah Harris, parents of William Coleman Harris, Nearby in House 60, Family 61 are Martha Luiza Milam's sister ELIZABETH and her husband Charles Saxson, and their sister Sarah Milam (later married Mr. Gammell).

Coleman Milam was carried to Laurens Co., SC 1787 by his father, Thomas Milam and his step-mother, Elizabeth (Talbert) Milam whom Thomas Milam had married 12 June 1786 in Halifax Co., Va. Coleman Milam married (1) c.1808 in Laurens Co., SC, as evidenced by the fact that his eldest son: THOMAS FERRILL MILAM, obviously named for the child's grandfather, was born there 1810. Thomas Ferrill Milam accompanied his father to Tenn., there married in Franklin Co. 1831 Margaret Bell, later emigrated to Arkansas where he died in Van Buren Hospital of C.S.A. and was buried in C.S.A. Cemetery.

2. Coleman Milam served in the War of 1812; he was a member of Captain Benjamin Lewis' Co., Tucker's Regt., stationed at Camp Alston, S.C. 1 Mar 1814-31 Mar 1814 as shown by official records of the Society of

Daughters of 1812.

In 1819 Coleman Milam made a deed for 24 acres of land on Duncan Creek, Laurens Co., S.C. which he was disposing of in preparation for his emigrating to Tennessee.
