

Dear Dr. Peeples: July 24, 1984
First let me apologize for this
tardy reply to your letter. Since
retiring at the first of the year, I
have not done a very good job of
managing my time! - Now to the Milam.
When I first started researching the
Milam family, I too, was working
on the Thomas b 1757 va. volume,
it seems you have some info.
I have overlooked and that is
where he went from S.C. Now let
me tell you how I fit in and what
I know. ~~Block~~ Two of my
gg grandmothers were the daughters
of a Thomas Milam b. S.C. between
1775-1794. He appears in the Lincoln
Co. In. Census of 1820 and that is
all we know about Thomas as he
does not appear in any subsequent
records. He married a Nancy Luna;
probably Sumner Co Tenn. about 1810-12.
My thoughts were, in the beginning, that
my Thomas may have been the son
of the elder Thomas (1757). I found
nothing to suggest that he had a

son named Thomas. In my search of Laurens Co. I found records of Thomas buying ^{and selling} the following land.

- 1) 1792 Thomas Milom from Hall ^{No. CREEK} 100 ac. on
- 2) 1793 Thomas Milom from Hall ^{No CREEK} 50 ac on
- 3) ^{JUNE} 1801 Thomas & Ely. Milom to John Milom ^{No CREEK} 100 ac on
- 4) ^{NOV} 1802 Thomas Milom to Motes ^{No CREEK} 50 ac on

• It seemed to me that he divesting himself of property prior to moving to Ind.

• Will of Elizabeth Milom 1823
adm. - Ferrill - She, no doubt, is Ely. Lucian Milom 1780-1823 wife of Bartlett 1750-1800 - They had a son Ferrill also.

* Coleman Milom also appears in 1840 Census of Coffee Co. Ind. (pg 175)

I have extensive information on the Milom family but Coleman does not appear in my records.

of some information sent to
me by Mr Shirley Linder
Rad a couple of years ago. It did
not fit my needs but there
are numerous ~~ref~~ references
to your Coleman. I am sending
the entire file for fear I might
