

GENERATION NO. 6: THOMAS MILAM

Born Halifax Co., Va. 1757  
Died Laurens Co., S.C. c.1818

EVIDENCES:

1. MILAM FAMILY CHART by Mrs. Leona Betteridge, Milam Family Historian, 2709 West Soundview Drive, Tacoma, Wash. 98466, shows THOMAS MILAM, born 1757, son of Revolutionary War Soldier JOHN MILAM of Virginia.
2. Letter of Jim L. Milum, 607 Skyline Drive, Harrison, Arkansas 72601, dated Sep 1983, confirming MILAM Family History as submitted in Application of Mrs. Cora McKenzie Peeples: "my information is the same as yours". Jim L. Milum is Secretary of the Jordan Milam Chapter, S.A.R., Harrison, Arkansas. Jordan Milam was NEPHEW of Revolutionary War Soldier JOHN MILAM, Jordan Milam's father being THOMAS MILAM, brother of said JOHN MILAM.
3. Letter of Mrs. Laura Madden Pulley, Chairman of Lineage Research Committee, Sullivan-Dunklin D.A.R. Chapter, Rt. 1, Isle O'Pines, Laurens Co., Waterloo, S. C. 29384, dated 20 Aug 1972: "My records state that four of John of Va.'s sons came to SC, namely Captain John, Benjamin, THOMAS and my Bartlett who did not come until last (1796)".
4. Halifax Co., Va. Tax List of 1785 shows THOMAS MILAM residing there.
5. US Census, 1790 Laurens Co., S.C.: THOMAS MILAM, with two males under 16 years (concluded to be his sons: COLEMAN MILAM and JOHN MILAM) and 3 females.
6. US Census, 1800 Laurens Co., S.C.: THOMAS MILAM, with two males 10/16 years (concluded to be his sons: COLEMAN MILAM and JOHN MILAM), two males under 10; THOMAS is 26/45 (in fact, he is 43 yrs old), two females under 10 and his (2nd) wife (Elizabeth Talbert Milam) 26/45.
7. THOMAS MILAM had married (2nd) 12 Jun 1786 in Halifax Co., Va. Elizabeth Talbert who thus became step-mother to COLEMAN MILAM.
8. THOMAS MILAM appears in US Census, 1810 Laurens Co., S.C. but not in US Census, 1820 Laurens Co. or thereafter.
9. ELIZABETH MILAM, widow (of Thomas Milam), appears in US Census, 1830 Franklin Co., Tenn. next door to her step-son COLEMAN MILAM.
10. There was no other THOMAS MILAM in S.C. until 1796 when his brother, Bartlett Milam (1750-1821) brought his son Thomas Milam, born 2 Mar 1785 in Va., who married c. 1818 Rachel Bell Jones (1800-1868). As Mrs. Pulley (in letter mentioned above) points out: "S.C. Equity Court Roll #1923, dated 23 Oct 1817, showing JOHN MILAM (Brother of COLEMAN MILAM who accompanied him and their step-mother ELIZABETH MILAM, widow, to Tennessee), son of THOMAS. (Note: this is proof-evidence) This had to be THOMAS, son of JOHN of Va., since Thomas, son of Bartlett and Elizabeth (Gwinn), married Rachel Bell Jones (1800-1868) and their children are not born until the 1820's."  
There is no will of Thomas Milam (1757-c.1818); the 1775 will of his uncle, Thomas Milam (1727-1775) of Bedford Co., Va. is irrelevant.
