

Among the papers left by my aunt, Miss Sally Miles, is a typewritten copy of "Family Memoranda" by Charles Fraser, Esq. of Charleston, South Carolina. The original was written in 1840 but there is no notation as to where the original is, when the copy was made, or by whom.

One excerpt is as follows: "Gazette of the State of South Carolina 5. Feb. 1784

William Fraser Esq.<sup>sr</sup> Attorney at Law, married to Sophia Miles of St. Bartholomew's Parish."

[ There is nothing else which would indicate how Sophia Miles was related to any others of the Miles family.]

Added to this document in a handwriting not familiar to me (ie: not that of my aunt or my father), is the notation that James Sanders Miles and Sarah Bond Warley had five children as follows:

- (1) William Porcher
- (2) James Warley
- (3) Edward R.
- (4) Charles R.
- (5) Francis Turquand

The order of these five sons is probably not correct as it is stated in a paper about James Warley Miles that he was the "oldest in a family of five brothers". \*
