(W.) Lavinia Chaplin b. Oct 30 - 1802 (town) d. April 3 - 1869

1st married to Robert Oswald - Oct 22 - 1818 she buried Barmore SC

she was a Baptist & buried at her Aunt Martha Chaplin house
in Gaffney S.C.

Eleanor Oswald, American soldier and journalist
b. in Eng. 1755-d. New York Sept 30-1795- He came
to America in 1770 through sympathy with the patriot
cause. In 1775-under Benedict Arnold whose
secretary he became, he served as Capt at Fort Mifflin
and also at Quebec. where Arnold being wounded
Oswald took command with great efficiency. In
1777 he rose to the rank of lieutenant colonel
he was opposed to Hamilton. etc

Oswald, Richard British diplomat b.
Scotland 1705-d. 1784 He spent several
years in America and after his return to Eng.
engaged in mercantile pursuits in London
At the close of the War of the Revolution, Oswald
because of his special knowledge of American
Conditions, was selected by the Earl of Shelburne
as one of the English envoys to negotiate the
Treaty of Paris Oswald was very well disposed
towards the new nation and even favored
the cession of Canada to the United States
He also furnished bail to the amount of £50,000 for
Henry Laurens

The earliest record I have of Cornalds
are that two (2) brothers William Cornald
and Robert Cornald served in the Bethel
Presbyterian Church as early as 1735-
well that had to be at least 21 year
old to have served in that capacity
This Bethel Church was ^{approximately of about 1700} located
near Waterborough which at one time
was for a short time the Capital of S.C.
William Cornald became Gen William
Cornald and he & his brother and another
member of Cornald of which I do not
have name were the first settlers of
Jacksonborough and Waterboro was
named for the Waters family who
settled there the same time as Cornalds.
The brother of whose name I have not
had children & grand children
The grand children William & Robert
Cornald were named for their Great Uncle

from the brother of Gen. William Cornald

Robert Cornald (no 2) married Lavinia Chapline
b. d. she married later ^{Rev} Hanson
Wade Duncan of Barnwell SC

The above record of Watterboro S.C. Presbyterian
Church records that 10 Cornalds are buried
at Bethel Cen. among them Gen. Cornald
& Robert Cornald no 1
