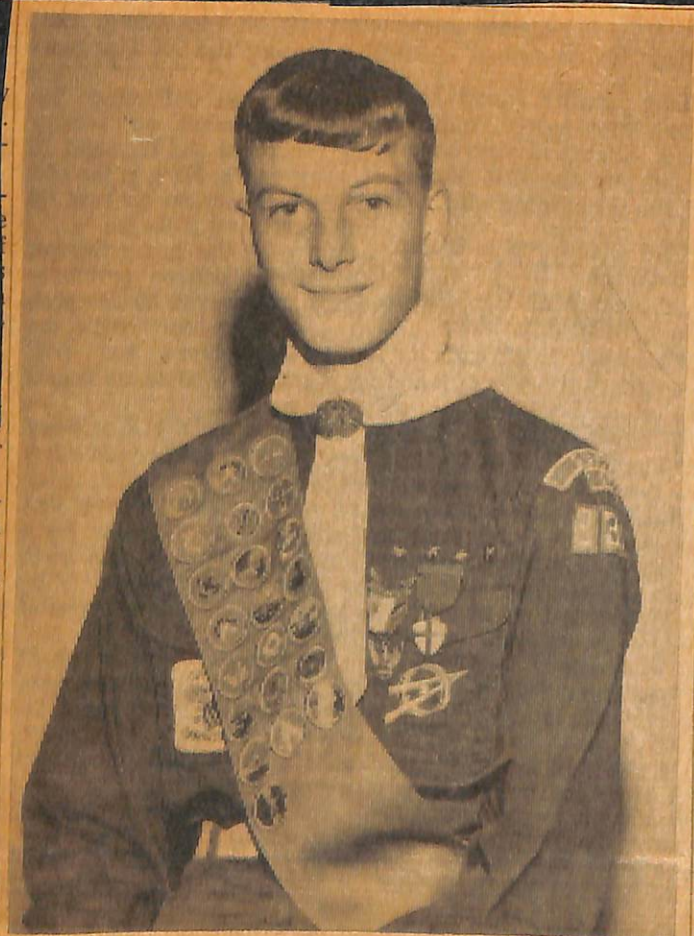

J. R. Peeples Appointed Sumter Building Official

City Manager Wade S. Kolb announced today the appointment of John Randolph "Randy" Peeples to the position of city building official, which recently became vacant with the death of J. H. Delk.

Peeples, 48, a native of Estill, has been a resident of Sumter for 23 years. After completing his high school education in Estill High School in 1937, he attended Georgia Tech in Atlanta, Ga., where he graduated in 1942 with a B.S. degree in Civil Engineering.

While attending Georgia Tech as a co-op student, Peeples worked with the Georgia Highway Department in bridge construction and with the South Carolina Highway Department in location surveys. He was a member of Theta Chi Fraternity, Ordnance ROTC, the American Society of Civil Engineers and Civil Crew.

In 1942 he began three years of service with the Ordnance Department of the U.S. Army, attached to the U.S. Air Force in North Africa and Italy, where he worked with bombs, ammunition, small arms and automotive problems. He was discharged with the rank of captain in 1945.

Shortly after his discharge from the Army, Peeples was employed by Boyle Construction Company and the Sumter Millwork Company, a division of Boyle Construction Company where he gained experience for 11 years in general construction and architectural millwork.

From 1957 to 1967, Peeples was employed by Williams Furniture Corporation, Southern Coating and Chemical Company, wholesale lumber and retail building materials, Westbury Lumber Company and other retail building material stores of Williams Furniture Company which merged with Georgia-Pacific Corp. In 1968, Peeples was employed by Lowe's Hardware and Building Materials until his appointment as city building official.

Peeples is married to the former Miss Ruth Elizabeth Pate of Bishopville and they have five children: John R. Peeples Jr., 19, an aircraft specialist with the USAF, now stationed in Charleston; David Dwane, 17, and Derbiana, 15, both students at Edmunds High School; Margaret Celia, 11, a student at Central Elementary School and Robert Frederick, 7, a second grader at Willow Drive School.

The family resides at 17 W. Charlotte Ave. and are members of Trinity Methodist Church, where Peeples is a member of the Trinity Methodist Men's Club, president of the Trinity Fellowship Sunday School Class and a member of the official board at Trinity.

He is vice-commander of American Legion Post No. 15 and is chef de gare of Forty and Eight Voiture No. 1254. He is also a member of the Sumter Elks Club, the Gamecock Lions Club and has served as scoutmaster for the local Boy Scouts.

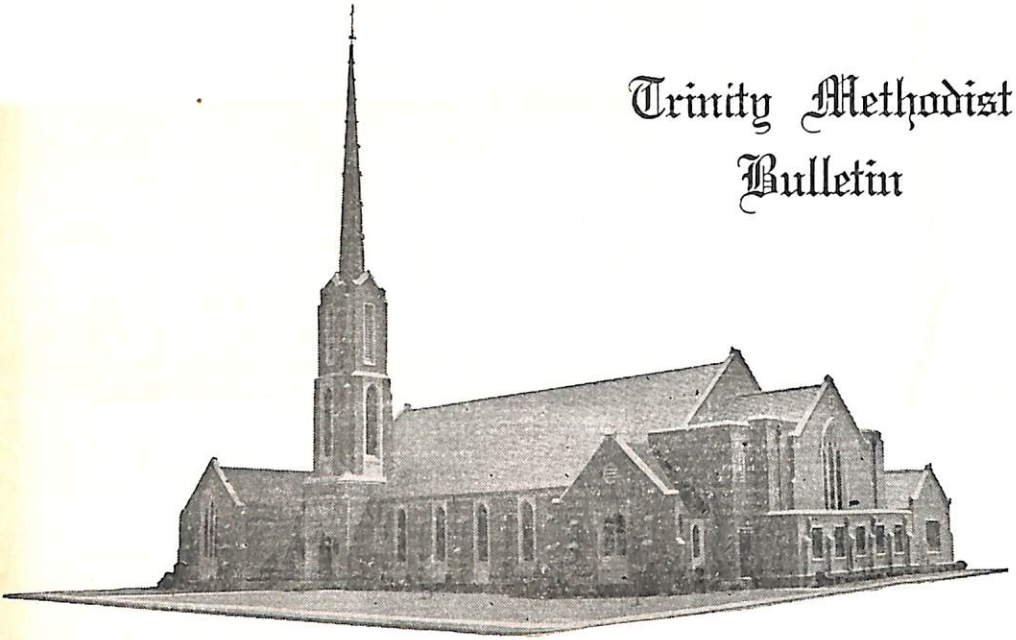
