22 Sept. 1679 Thomas Chaplin - to London on ship Halligo Merchant, Roger Deomer, Commander

d. 3 July 1678 James Reynolds Do you know if our Reynolds came here via Barbados? Do you suppose he could have been the father of our William and Richard - Richard had a son, James, as you know. And I'm wondering, too, about the two Chaplins? So many questions always and so few answers!

Please tell me, the next time you write, about Cousin Elizabeth Schieffelin - Who is she and how am I kin to her and what will she be speaking on? Have never heard of her before.

Am thankful to say we are well and busy here. No special news with us - Did I tell you that Mary Rose & Bice (the ones who went to N.C. last summer) are expecting baby #2 this July? Don't suppose they'll be able to get down there this year. Here looking forward to the arrival of spring and Easter. The cold this winter seems to have killed off most of our roses, the gardenias, the pyracantha, some of our Camellias and azaleas and I don't know what else. This makes two winters in a row that we've had extreme cold that's hurt so many things. They've been told not to cut anything back yet nor to dig up and throw away anything for they might come out from the roots - but they surely do look dead to me. But the bulbs are blooming gloriously, praise the Lord. I do love them!

Now Robert I must close and go listen to Charles Stanley from Atlanta on TV - He's such a terrific preacher. Wish we had someone like him here in Charlotte. He's so consistently good and tells us what we all need to hear and take to heart and act upon! Wiley joins me in fond love and best wishes always to you and Cora.
