You asked me to let you know about our family. Now this is what I have found out about my father's father. He was James Pringle Rhodes, eldest son of George and Evelina Rhodes born Dec 26th, 1824. He married Margaret Pundill Lantun Dec 17th 1846 to them was born James Henry Rhodes, Susan Ella, George Augustus, ~~John~~ Charlotte.

James Henry ^{Rhodes} married Mary Lowley of Rome, they had Chara Lee, Bessie, Annie Bell, & Herbert. His wife died, then he married a Miss Wood, they had two girls but I don't know their names.

Chara Rhodes + Bessie died
before they married, Herbert
married a girl from Georgia
he + his wife are both dead but
there is one daughter living.
Annie Bell Rhodes married a
Mr Smith and has five
children. If you want their
names I can find out later.
Elba Rhodes married Thomas
B. Ellis on the 25th of Dec
1871-, they had three children
Maggie Ellis + George Ellis
and Daisie. George Augustus
married Julia Martha Baynard
on Dec 2nd 1875: they had four
daughters. Carrie, Josephine, May
+ Corinne. Charlotte died
when she was 2 years old.
Hope you can make this

out, if you cant come on
up to see me. Wish you
all would come - gain and
spend the day, how about some
Saturday let me know, when
dont put off too long. Hope
you are all well. Know the farmers
were glad of the rain, I hear
that some have had to plant
some of their crops over on
account of the cold, maybe the
worst is over, but Easter is a
long ways off yet. Hope to
see you on the fifth Sunday
if not before.
