in 1850 under the title of Walderman & Co., and about ten years later this was changed into Roberts & Co. Robert Roberts was a native of Liverpool, England, born in 1831, and was about fifteen years of age when his parents moved to New Orleans. He learned the carpenter's trade in that city and drifted from that into the sash, door and blind business. He was married there to Miss Eliza Hammond, who was a native of New York city, and they reared two children: Willard and John W. The present business started in a small way, but by careful management and excellent business ability the annual sales were increased until they now amount to \$200,000. Mr. Roberts was a prominent business man and an upright, honorable citizen. He died on the 21st of July, 1891. He took an active interest in all matters of moment, contributed liberally to all worthy enterprises, and was held in high esteem by all. He was a very prominent Mason. His eldest son, Willard, has continued the management of the office of the factory, and with creditable success. The latter was born in New Orleans in 1868, received his education in the best schools of the city, but when sixteen years of age he left his books to enter the factory where he remained four years. He there learned the principal part of the business, after which he entered the office, where he remained until the father's death, when he assumed the entire management of the business. This firm employs about 125 men. Mr. Roberts is a member of the Southern Athletic club and is a wide-a-wake, enterprising young man.

Dr. W. F. Roberts, a physician and planter of the Eighth ward of East Feliciana parish, was born in East Baton Rouge parish in 1839, a son of Sylvester Dunn Roberts, who was born in Sumter district, S. C., in 1789, and his wife, Lydia Jane (Hughes) Roberts, a native of the same state and district, who was born in 1798. They were reared and educated in Sumter district, and were there married. With their two children they came to Louisiana early in 1820 and settled in what is now the Eighth ward of East Feliciana parish, on the Amite river, which place is still in the family, being now owned by the subject of this notice. At the time they landed, and for a number of years afterward, the country was infested with bears, panthers, wild cats and other wild animals, from which the family was in constant danger. In 1841 or 1842 Mr. Roberts moved to Amite county, Miss., settling near Centerville, where he died April 10, 1851. Politically he was a democrat. His wife, the mother of our subject, survived him for a number of years, dying March 25, 1881. She was a devoted mother and for many years was a member of the Presbyterian church. At the time of the death of her husband the estate was left under a heavy debt, which, by good management and the utmost economy, she was able to pay, clearing the farm from all indebtedness. The father of our subject was a son of Robert Roberts, a native of South Carolina, a very wealthy man who reared a large family. The family of Roberts descended from ancestors who came from England before the Revolutionary war, the first one who came to this country being William Roberts, who settled in the South Carolina colony, so called after the state was districted, and he is said to have belonged to a distinguished family of nobility in England, and judging from the amount of means and stores he possessed and the large section of land he owned, it is evident that at any rate he descended from a wealthy ancestry. [This William Roberts had four sons: Robert, John M., Benjamin and Harry. When it was evident the war was imminent between the colonies and Great Britain, Robert Roberts, on the 4th of November, 1775, enrolled in the first South Carolina regiment as a private, he being at that time only seventeen years of age. After that he became attached to Gen. Francis Marion's brave veterans and continued in active service until the close of the war, in 1783. After the war he married Miss Agnes Church Dunn, of South Carolina. His brother, John M. Roberts, became one of the most distinguished Baptist ministers in South Carolina, and was a man of great learning, and was president of the Statesburg academy for sixteen years. He was also the author of several religious works, some of which are published. Benjamin Roberts was a planter and lived and died in the same county. Dr. Harry Roberts was recognized as one of the leading physicians and surgeons of South Carolina. After the war Mr. Roberts and his family settled on one of his plantations in South Carolina as a planter, which occupation he followed until his death. He left several children. The following tragic story is still in the minds of many of the people of this state: During the Revolutionary war Robert Roberts and a distinguished planter by the name of Castles were seized by a band of Tories, and both were despoiled of their clothing and they were tied to trees, and the Tories demanded them to tell where their sons were and in what service they were enlisted. As neither was able to tell, small targets were placed over their hearts, and deliberate aim was taken and they were shot. Here they were left until removed by their families. This is only an instance of the horrid scenes of the Tory outrage and murder in South Carolina in the Revolutionary days. One of the sons of Robert Roberts became a distinguished minister. To the parents of our subject were born sixteen children, named as follows: Benjamin D., who died August 23, 1833, in East Feliciana parish; Robert Roberts, who is yet living in St. Helena parish, was born in 1817; Margaret

W., was born in 1821 and married Stephen Rourk, by whom she had one child, and father and mother and child are now deceased; Sarah, who was born in 1823 and died in 1888, married Samuel Smith, and both of them died leaving three children; John M., was born in 1826 and died September 20, 1836; Eliza was born, in 1829 and died March 24, 1831; Louisa V., was born January 7, 1832, and died September, 1840; Henry D., was born November 12, 1833, and died March 10, 1882; the others died in infancy, unnamed. Our subject was the youngest of the sixteen children, and was reared in Mississippi and educated mostly in Louisiana at the common schools. He took up the study of medicine the first year after the war, and graduated at the Tulane university in 1867, and soon after commenced the practice of his profession in this parish. He has since continued his practice here and has at the same time engaged successfully in planting. He was married in 1867 to Miss Sarah O. Rowley, a native of this parish and the daughter of Job and Martha C. (Roberst) Rowley. She was reared and educated in East Feliciana parish, and is the eldest child in a family of two daughters and a son. The brother is deceased and the sister is Miss Mollie L. Rowley, who lives with her sister. To Dr. and Mrs Roberts have been born ten children, six of whom are now living: Willie J. is a graduate from Centenary college in 1890, with the highest honors of a class of thirteen, and won the McGehee medal during his sophomore year for the best work in oratory (he has taken a year at Vanderbilt university, taking the degree of B. D. and will take the degree of A. M. the coming year, being now engaged in teaching school and preaching in the Methodist church. He is considered one of the brightest young men of the parish, and has received high compliments as to his ability from Bishop Keener and others); Maurice D. is at Centenary college; Augusta; Robert Lee; Lewis Corydon; the youngest child is named J. A. B. Jones; Nettie Adelia, and H. Doty died when young; the other two also died in infancy, being named John W. and Eunice. In 1861 our subject, after serving for some time in a volunteer company raised in Amite county, Miss., enlisted from Wilkinson county, Miss., in the Confederate service in the Twenty-first Mississippi regiment, volunteer infantry, commanded by Col. B. G. Humphrey. The first battle he participated in was at Garnet's farm, below Richmond, on the Chickahominy river. He was also in the first battle of Manassas Junction and in all the battles of the war in which his regiment took part, some of which were Seven Pines, Malvern Hill and Gettysburg. In the last-named battle Dr. Roberts was wounded in the right leg by a spent ball. This wound was so slight that he was disabled from duty but a short time. He afterward took part in the battles of Fredricksburg and Spottsylvania Court House and surrendered with his regiment at Appomattox Court House in 1865. During the latter part of the war he was made a corporal and accompanied his command from the Army of Virginia to assist Bragg in Tennessee at the battle of Chickahominy. After being paroled he returned home and continued his study of medicine. He now has a large practice in this ward, and is also somewhat extensively engaged in planting, owning several farms, one in Mississippi—the old home place near Centerville. Politically he is a democrat, and takes much interest in the measures of that party. He has been a member of the school board and is considered one of the leading men of the parish. He and his wife are in the enjoyment of a fine plantation home, situated on the Amite river about eleven miles from Clinton. He is a member of the Masonic lodge and of the Knights of Honor, of which he is the medical examiner. Dr. and Mrs. Roberts are active members of the Methodist Episcopal church, of which he has been the steward for some time. He is held in the highest regard, not only in the parish in which he lives, but in the surrounding parishes, where he is quite well and favorably known. He has done much toward the advancement of education and is a liberal contributor of all laudable enterprises of benefit to the public. He is justly proud of the worthy ancestors from which he is descended, and it is not to be wondered at that he is a man of such worth, as he comes from such sterling forefathers.

James M. Robertson, planter, Plaquemine, La. To omit the name of Mr. Robertson from this volume would be to leave out one of the prominent and successful planters of the parish, who has not only made himself thoroughly identified with the farming interests of this section but by his pleasant, genial manner has won a host of friends. He was born where he now lives, in Iberville parish, May 9, 1843, to the union of James E. and Earnestine (Schlatre) Robertson. James E. Robertson was a native of Nashville, Tenn., and a grandson of James Robertson an Indian fighter of early Tennessee fame. James E. was the son of Blount Robertson, who was named in honor of another Tennessee hero. Blount Robertson, came to the wilds of Louisiana about 1827 and located on the Mississippi river near Plaquemine, where he engaged in planting, as did also his son James E. The latter at one time was a member of the legislature from Iberville parish and his brother Edward was a member of congress from Baton Rouge district, while W. B., another brother, was district judge. James E. was born in 1810 and died in 1854. The Schlatre family is of German descent

Hulbert - Brunson - Roberts - Row - Avant - Peak

Will was found among the published Wills of S.C. for James Hulbert, but the following conveyance names his daughters and their husbands. 5-9-1729, Benjamin Hulbert and wife Abigail, one of the daughters of James Hulbert dec'd, John Brunson and wife Anne, one of the daughters of James Hulbert dec'd, William Row and wife Rachel, one of the daughters of James Hulbert dec'd - all of Craven Co., S.C. to John Berre of Craven Co. for 5 shillings 300 acres and buildings, bound vacant, Abraham Michau, Christopher May signed Benjamin Roberts, Abigail, her mark, Roberts, John Brunson, Ann, her mark, Brunson, William, his mark, Row, Rachel, her mark, Row; St. James Santee, 4-11-1732 John Conbold and John Jasque, witnesses duly sworn they had seen the above sign before Elias Horry.¹ Info. on the daughters of James Hulbert:

1. Abigail Hulbert married Benjamin Roberts.

Benjamin Roberts was on the Petit Jury List in Prince George Winyah in 1731 and Prince Frederick Parish in 1737.² Prince Frederick Parish Register: Benjamin and Abigail Roberts as the parents of the following children³

James Roberts born 1-20-1724/25.

Josiah Roberts born 11-30-1726.

John Roberts born 3-6-1736, Bapt. 10-16-1737.

David Roberts born 7-9-1739, Bapt. 11-11-1739.

One Benjamin Roberts, his mark, planter of Prince Frederick Par., Craven Co. made his Will 8-11-1752, pr. 9-7-1753: sons Samuel, James, Francis, William, John, and Benjamin; daus Mary, Elizabeth, Rachel; mentions residue of estate divided between sons John and Benjamin and after charges for their bringing up are paid then whole estate to be sold by executors; executors: Thomas Charnock, Mary Roberts, William Davis; Witn.: Saml Tyler, Richd. Smith.⁴ If this is the Benjamin Roberts who married Abigail Hulbert - note that only 2 of the children of the will are mentioned in the Prince Frederick Par. Register, but note also the break in the birth years of the children in the parish register. One Benjamin Roberts married Mary molton 1-12-1730 according to St. Philip's Parish Register.⁵ Benjamin Roberts was a juryman from St. Philip's Parish 1740 - 1767.⁶ Therefore, it is most probable that there were at least 2 Benjamin Roberts living at the same time in S.C.

2. Rachel Hulbert married William Row. Nothing more.

3. Anne Hulbert married John Brunson.

Pr. Frederick Par. Register: Anne Brunson died 3-6-1730/31; John Brunson, a widower, married on 8-13-1743 Susanna Robinson, a widow.⁷ John Brunson's 2nd wife Susanna may have been married several times. Prince Frederick Par. Reg.: Peter Sanders and wife Susannah had 7 children Baptized in the parish; Peter Sanders died 2-2-1730.⁸ The Will of Peter Sanders planter of Craven Co. was written 8-30-1727, pr. 6-24-1730: wife Susannah and 6 of the children Baptized at Pr. Frederick⁹; the only child not mentioned in his Will was dau. Susannah who was born in 1729, 2 yrs after it was
