Dear Robert:

It was good of you to write (27 May), and have a few more notes for you, which am hoping are readable & understandable. (Before I curtail Family History)

Bolton, "An American Armory", pg 140 Robert Argent ?, 2 <sup>①</sup>  
Chev Sa. A Mullet in Chief. Crest: A Mullet Sable. Motto:  
Caton Wrth Caton - Dow A Digon. Book Plate Photo, Santee,  
S. C. 1686. From Basel, Switz. This was my 1 Published record, although I had Miller's, which I had sketched.

Then the Arms from Boston, with the Crescent in Dexter Chief. Then Mrs. Irby C. Nichols, Baton Rouge 70802, who had Painted 2-3-4-5 for Various Robert, & Roberts. She had the Mullets as Gules, did mine with "S", which have changed both.

After the College of Arms, rilled me, then made a short study, & Papworth shows Sir Wm. Robert, & next: but a Crescent Sable, for another name. How easy these very little Errors, creep in. Then, I wanted something Official, but could not obtain, but did find 3 old-old Publications, then The Br. Museum (withoug any Crest, Motto, Frills). A Professor, Roberts, Aberystwyth, confirmed the Translation, but Dow, should be Duw.

A page away from some of our Robert, 1664, I've found a HUGUENIN.

No, you are Right, 96 Pendleton, Elias bb 1678 - 1709. My thoughts were Grand Children, & there was a Roberts Church there. It is more than a guess, but Postive Items have not shown up.

Last year, I received a p-c of a letter written by Jas. D. Roberts, to Aunt Mary Evans, ?, Fatheree, Smith in N. Miss. <sup>②</sup> 1870, because of word brought by Mr. Ratcliff, with an account of the Original Settlers on Homochitta River-Franklin/Amite County, Miss., & his Family. These Items are very hard to come by, but there must be some hid away, somewhere.

Thos. J. Roberts Family is having a Re-Union June 3, at Jena, La., & do not think I will attend, but have sent a few items found, since the last one 1971. I am very un-social now-a-day.
