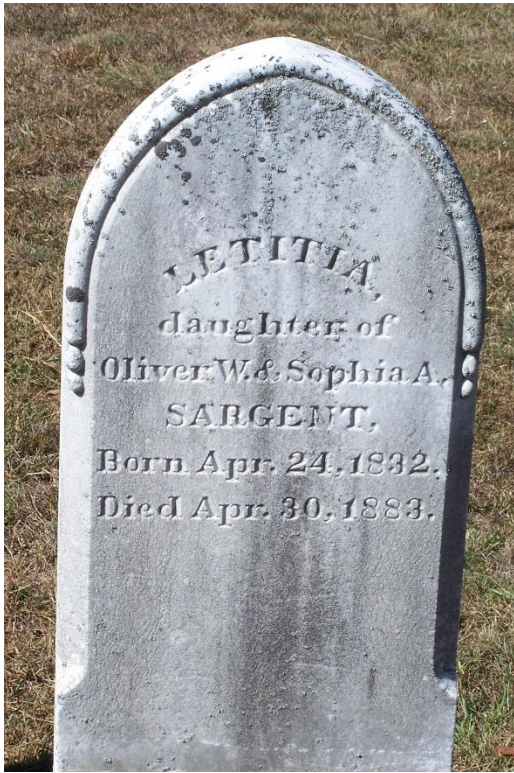

Letitia Sargent was born April 25, 1832 in Gloucester, Essex, Massachusetts to Oliver W. Sargent (1807-1866) and Sophia Ann Day (1810-1893).¹ Records of the New England Freedmen's Aid Society (NEFAS) show that she was a teacher on Hilton Head Island in May and June of 1865 and by July of the same year had been transferred to Charleston, SC.² She may have been appointed by the NEFAS or another society before May 1865 but has not been found in earlier 'Teachers' Lists' yet. Miss Sargent died on April 30, 1883 from "consumption of blood" in Everett, Massachusetts and is buried in Mount Adnah Cemetery in the same town.³
