1. Ann Ludlow married Francis Dashwood 26 May 1773, Hempstead, Nassau County, New York. She was the daughter of Gabriel Ludlow and Elizabeth Crommelin. (Note: Tucker's MARRIAGE LICENSES OF THE PROVINCE OF NEW YORK PRIOR TO 1784 states this couple married in 1779.) Sources: Carton, Marie L. 2. Ann Ludlow married Henry Brockholst Livingston (1757-1823). She was his 2nd wife.

1. Anthony Ludlam died 1681-2, and buried in Mecox Cemetery, Bridgehampton, Long Island, New York. He was in his 31st year. [Note: some dispute over the reading of this gravestone. Others believe he was in his 51st year, having been born about 1631.] According to Howell, Anthony's wife's name was Sarah, and children were: Anthony (1671-) and Phebe (m. Jonah Rogers). [Note: IGI records at the Family History Library of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints state that Anthony married Sarah Cook.]

2. Anthony Ludlam, born 1671, son of Anthony and Sarah Ludlam, died 21 December 1723, and was buried in Mecox Cemetery, Bridgehampton, Long Island, New York. He was aged 53 years. According to Howell, Anthony had three wives: 1. m. about 1695, East Hampton, L.I., Patience Barnes (1677-1708), 2. Abigail, & 3. Rebecca Shaw (m. 20 December 1716, East Hampton, L.I.)

Children born in Southampton, L.I.: Anthony (1699-), Patience (1696- m. Mr. Shaw), Samuel (1700-), Phebe (1698- m. Mr. Davis), Sarah (1702- m. Mr. Baker) and Temperance (1705-). [Note: IGI records at Family History Library name another child: William (1704-)]

3. Anthony Ludlam died 3 May 1716 in the 17th year of his age.

6. Captain Anthony Ludlow was born 1781, died 12 November 1843, and was buried in Mecox Cemetery, Bridgehampton, Long Island, New York. He was 62 years of age according to his gravestone. He was the son of Anthony (1748-1809) and Elizabeth Ludlam/Ludlow. He married Abigail Halsey (1783-), and had children: Jesse (1806-), Samuel, Lafayette, Charity, Abigail, Caroline, Charles Anthony (1817-), Elizabeth, Charlotte and Augustus (1826-).

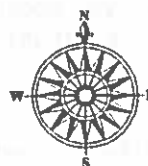

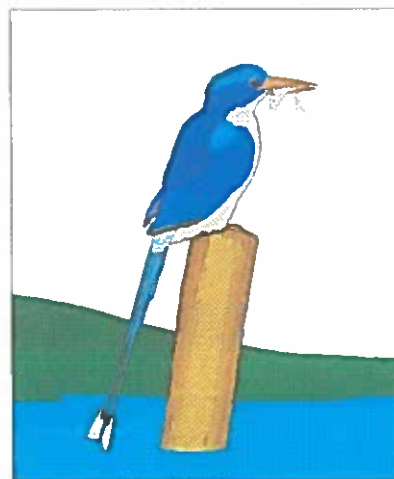

The First Wife of Cornelius Ludlow

A reappraisal
by *Mary Balderstone*

The purpose of this article is to provide a correction for more than one-hundred and forty years of published genealogical material on the Ludlow and Cooper families of Morris County, New Jersey. The error arose in perhaps the earliest published genealogy treating this family history, Family Records, or Genealogies of the First Settlers of Passaic Valley (And Vicinity) by John Littell, initially published in 1852.¹

Littell, in discussing the family of Daniel Cooper gives birth dates for the three oldest children as follows:

1. Catherine, who was born January, 1728, and married Colonel Cornelius Ludlow.
2. Daniel Cooper, Jun., born 14th January, 1729, and died May, 1787.
3. Agnes, born 15th, May, 1732.²

In reference to the Ludlow family, Littell writes:

Col. Cornelius Ludlow, (son of Jeremiah) and his 1st wife, Catherine Cooper, had but one child:

1. John, who married, 19th October, 1772, 1st. Catherine Cooper, his cousin, daughter of Daniel Cooper, Jun., and had five children.³

Arthur E. Cooper repeated this information in his article for the Proceedings of the New Jersey Historical Society, Third Series Volume III.

By his first wife (Catherine Cooper)

John Ludlow, b. Dec. 14, 1752; d. Mar. 26, 1823.⁴

Arthur Cooper exhibits his awareness of Agnes Cooper in his published hand drawn family tree. Agnes is shown as a cut-off branch, with birth date May, 1732 and a blank for death date.⁵

Other authors have repeated this information, including Martha Jane Humphreys Kinsey, in a privately printed work entitled A Family History, available in the Cincinnati Public

Library. This work, edited by George Stearns Kinsey, appears by internal dates to have been printed in the 1930s or later, although it is otherwise undated.⁶

Catherine Bigham Brode, in her privately printed Ludlow-Ross Genealogy, not only identifies Catherine Cooper as the wife of Cornelius Ludlow, but also lists Agnes Cooper as born in 1732 and died in 1732.⁷

I am afraid that Ms Ross has killed off Agnes Cooper somewhat prematurely. All authors seem to have been aware that Agnes Cooper existed, but none seems to have consulted the will of Daniel Cooper, senior.

Daniel Cooper looms larger than life in Morris County New Jersey history. He was a judge in the Provincial Court and, in a famous case, presided with two other judges over the counterfeiting trial of his son Benjamin Cooper. Daniel Cooper, senior, lived to over one hundred years, outliving five wives and taking the sixth wife at over age 90.

To research Daniel Cooper's will I first consulted the abstract in the New Jersey State Archives Calendar of Wills. A surprise awaited me there that lead me to request a photocopy of the original from the New Jersey State Archives.

Daniel Cooper's will was written on Feb. 1, 1791, at which time he was well over ninety years old. A codicil was added on April 24, 1792, and the will was proved on June 20, 1795. Both in the original will and the codicil, Daniel Cooper provides a legacy for his grandson John Ludlow: Wording from the abstract " Grandson John Ludlow (son of daughter Agness Ludlow)".⁸

At my request, in 1983, the New Jersey State Archives kindly supplied a photocopy of the original will in which appears the following bequest:

Item I give and bequeath to John Ludlow the son of my Daughter Agnes Ludlow the sum of fifty pounds lawful money to be paid to him within ? year after my decease. (The figure or word giving the number of years is blocked out by a piece of tape holding sections of the will together).⁹

The codicil deals with the distribution of the share of Daniel Cooper, Jun., the deceased son. In this section, grandson John Ludlow is again referred to as son of the daughter Agnes.

This will may not have been available for examination by previous genealogists working on this family. To refute the evidence of the will it would be necessary to assume that Daniel Cooper was somewhat senile and forgetful in preparing his will. The detail with which other heirs are mentioned and provided for make this conclusion unlikely.

I accept that the mother of John Ludlow and wife of Cornelius Ludlow was probably Agnes Ludlow, although I know of no record of the marriage. John did marry his cousin, Catherine Cooper, daughter of Daniel Cooper, Jun., and his first wife Catherine Hankinson. John Ludlow had daughters named Agnes and Catherine. Cornelius Ludlow named a daughter Agnes, but did not name a daughter Catherine, as might have been expected had his first wife been named Catherine.

John Littell's book is especially frustrating since it is one of the few sources for genealogical research on families in this part of New Jersey. No federal census records are extant before 1830. Some colonial lists, such as militia lists provide a substitute for that period. There are some collections of marriage records from the early churches, and, of course, the New Jersey Archives Series, providing will abstracts, some colonial records, and newspaper abstracts. Land and court records should also be consulted.

John Littell was writing at a time when it could have been possible to talk with older people who might have some personal knowledge of these families. His book provides no footnotes or sources for his information. Also, many of the family group listings lack dates altogether.

Shortly after the opening of the Northwest Territory to settlement, two Ludlow brothers, Israel and John, sons of Cornelius Ludlow, moved west to land which is now Cincinnati, Ohio. Their many descendants, in the midwest and perhaps in other parts of the country, have an interest in unraveling the family genealogical puzzles.
