YONGE Fuller and Francis YONGE, Sr."

My Chera understood was that Robert (Above)  
of "Toscoloo" Plantation, Yonge's Island, S.C., was the  
Brother of My Hon. Francis YONGE, Lords Proprietors  
Surv-Gen. of the Bahamas, Carolina, and Georgia,  
Father of Hon. Henry YONGE, Sr., Loyalist, H.M. Surv-  
GEN of Ga., Marrried Eliz. Bellinger then "the  
REBEL" Christiana Bulloch, sister of Gen. Archer Bulloch

However, this book says "Hon Francis YONGE, Surv-  
GEN of S.C., 1717-1719, Member King's Council, Chief  
Justice, S.C. 1721, died 1733/4" "IN 1732, Francis  
YONGE speaks of his wife Lydia and cozen Robert  
YONGE." "Hon. Francis YONGE married first, the widow  
of Geo. Fletcher of Ben Buloch (second wife Lydia),  
By Mrs. Fletcher and Hon. Henry YONGE (SR), Surv-GEN  
Ga. 1760, Member Ben Hill Council, M. 1st 1758 Elizabeth  
Bellinger," etc.

As My Beloved Grandfather was Edw. YONGE  
Wooten, I'd prefer to go in on the YONGE lineage,  
But Bellinger ok.
