## Broughton

The following is taken from a Sketch : "The Name And Family- Broughton" by Henry E. Waite , Esq. West Newton, Mass.

With few exceptions all the families that have borne the name in England are traced to the counties of Chester and Buckingham. The name continued prominent among the knights and sheriffs of England for three or four centuries until the titular made lines became extinct and their estates passed through female heirs to other families.

Note at foot of page! --- In county of Chester the Broughtons descend in male line from Hugh de Vernon , baron of Shipbrook at time of the Conquest whose 4th son , Richard de Vernon was father of Adam de Nafton, County of Warwick, whose issue assumed their local name from "Broughton" in Staffordshire. In the county of Buckingham, at Domesday, Survey the principal manor of Broughton was held by Walter Gifford, Earl of Buckingham and cousin of the "Conqueror". His subfendatory was Huges de Bolebec whose descendants- the Veris.-Earls of Oxford continued to hold it admitting under them another subfendatory--supposedly to have been a junior branch of the same family who took the name from the place before the year-1200!! ( See Ormond's Cheshire; Shaw's Staffordshire Ellis' Antiquities of Heraldry; Burke's Peerage, etc.

(A full Genealogy of Broughtons of New England is given in this sketch, also the following:---Thomas Broughton living at or near Charleston, S.C as early as 1699 was on the list of proprietors deputies as the representative of Lord Carteret in 1702, colonel of one of the royal regiments in 1704; Councillor and Collector of Customs 1708, Surveyor General 1709; Speaker of the House of Assembly 1719, and 1725 to 1730, their Lieutenants- Governor and finally Governor of the Province from May 1735 until his death 1738. He married a daughter of Sir Nathaniel Johnston, General of the Leeward Islands and one of the early Governors of S.C. His son Nathaniel of a "Free School erected on St. Johns Parish

In King Ethelrieds Charter to the monastery of Shaftesbury in England A. D. 1001 Elfurig's boundaries at "Broctum" are mentioned. The Domesday Book of War, the Conqueror A. D. 1086 describes 34 manors of "Broctums" variously latinized by the clerks of the records to: Broilton, Brocton, Bretten, Brocton, and Broughton perhaps according to the pronunciation peculiar to the localities where the manors were located. Later the orthography of :-Broughton, seems to have been generally adopted. The name in America is locally applied to an Island on the Altamaha River, Ga. while it rarely occurs as a family name. With fewer exceptions all families bearing the name in England.

#### Delves-Broughton

The connection of Delves and Broughton families came through the marriage of: Sir Brian-Broughton's only daughter of and sole heir of Sir Thomas Delves of Dodington, County of Chester. Bart. The Brian Broughton b. Sept. 19, 1677 married Elizabeth Delves Feb. 10, 1710. They had 4 children ---Brian, Thomas, Jane, Elizabeth- In 1710- Sir Brian succeeded to the Broughton Estates. His son Brian, Born 6th Jan. 1718 and to the Dodington Estates also in 1727 through the assuming in compliance with will of his grandfather Sir Thomas Delves the surname of Delves. From the records of an old Cheshire Family ( A very handsome book, with many exquisite pictures of both Delves and Broughton Estates).

In 1708-Col Edm. Lynte was made Governor, but died soon after, competition arose as to successor. One party was for Robert Gibbs another for Thomas Broughten. The former carried the election.

Thinking bribery had been used to gain the office a commission was sent to Charles Craven, a man of great courage and integrity. His council was composed of Thomas Broughten (the son-in law of Sir Nathaniel Johnson and who in 1704-began to build Mulberry Castle)

Page 192- "The Chapel of Ease" stood about 7 miles below Strawberry Ferry; a brick edifice in the form of a Roman Cross. After a few years use, it was accidentally burned down---- Amongst names recorded on the ancient tombstones are; Broughten, Broun, & Deas----- There is no record of the time when the chapel was buildt. something like the figure 1721- appears on the brick and from a read law we find it was standing in 1725. The eldest inscription on a tomb there that is legible is-1757- It is that of Mr. Nathaniel Broughten, of Mulberry Castle, in St. Johns Parish, son of Col. Thomas Broughten, who built castle, commencing it in 1714; and the grandson of Governor Nath Johnson who died in 1713.
