To all Christian people unto whom this present writing  
shall come I Thomas Tucker of St. Helena parish Granville County send greeting  
Know ye that I Thomas Tucker for divers good causes and valuable considerations  
methenunto moving have given and granted and by these presents do give grant  
and confirme unto Catharine Greene of the parish and County aforesaid all and  
singular the following Negro Slaves Viz: Three Negro men named Stephen, Tobe  
and August, one Negro boy named Tom, one Negro Wench named Lucy, and one  
Negro Wench named Sarah with her Child named Dice. To have and to hold all  
and singular the said Negro Slaves together with their increase forever of me Thomas  
Tucker unto the said Catharine Greene her executors Administrators and Assigns from  
henceforth to her and their own proper use and uses thereof and therewith to do order and  
dispose at her and their Wills and pleasure as of their own proper Goods and Chattels  
freely and peaceably and quietly without any manner of hindrance or denial of me  
the said Thomas Tucker or any other person or persons whatsoever of all which Slaves  
I the said Thomas Tucker have put the said Catharine Greene in full and freeable  
possession by Virtue hereof. In Witness whereof I the said Thomas Tucker have  
hereunto set my hand and seal the 28 day of June the year of our Lord 1773
