

Could she have been a widow, Mrs. Sarah Harvey who on 11 October 1831 married DR. THOMAS HARRISON McCALLA CUPTIS? (Rev. Basil Manley's marriage records.)

Capers Connections by Ellison Capers IV p. 244 gives Martha S. Red Book Jenkins daughter of Samuel Jenkins and Jane Reynolds as "died 1827 unmarried".
